

## Supply list for class:

Masters touch oil paint from Hobby Lobby is acceptable for the price.

Winsor Newton or Gamblin is more expensive but worth the money and will give a better experience.

Zinc titanium White

Lamp Black

Permanent Alizarin Crimson ( cooler red )

Vermillion ( bright red )

Naples Yellow ( light warm yellow )

Yellow Ochre ( cooler Yellow )

Cerulean Blue ( warmer blue )

Ultramarine Blue ( cooler Blue )

I would not recommend water mixable oils unless you have an adverse reaction to oils. Try using protective gloves. The blue ones.

Brushes are very important.

Select a larger HOG BRISTLE china bristle is the same thing. I find that a filbert ( flat brush with an oval tip )

A smaller one, size 2 ( about 1/4 " wide ) and a size 8 ( about 3/8 " )

Pretty good brushes are made out of artificial hog bristle ( talon ) Masters touch at Hobby Lobby ). Oil paint is expensive. I've given you 2 possibilities. Please don't scrimp and buy cheaper supplies.

On some occasions I have used chip brushes from paint stores. I use those when I want a special effect in my painting or pitting in broad background colors.

More importantly Keep all you brushes clean. Clean with solvents My fav. Is Gamsol. And finish cleaning with Murphys Oil soap from the grocery.

Some oil paints have a longer drying time. I would suggest Gamsol. It's a medium to add to your paint to make your paint smoother and dry more quickly.

( important ) I will discuss palettes in class.
